The most used type in this study is material process with 84 occurrences s (33,5%), and material process is used in several types of English text. Based on the various types of English texts, the exact text type for this video is narrative text. It's because narrative text describes events, actions, or experiences, and this video describes the events, actions, or experiences that happen in the live action series and analyze the spelling and unfamiliar words based on the scene.
